- **Open Funding Opportunity**: Capital Assistance for Disaster Response and Recovery Efforts (CADRE) EHBs: **May 6**; Cannot extend deadline. Will likely spread money among remaining applicants if don't have enough applicants.
- COVID-19 Funding

H8C: \$100 million to 1,381 health centers. Progress reports due yesterday, 96 percent reported. If among 4 percent who didn't report, be sure to get extension from your project officer. **H8D:** \$1.32 billion to 1,387 health center. CARES funding. One additional technical assistance call on Monday, April 27. What can you do, what you can't do. Applications due May 8.

- CHCs have been incredibly creative re temporary sites. HRSA clarified policy on temporary sites. PAL 2020-05 on the BPHC Scope of Project webpage. Project officer may contact you with questions to make sure you are following rules. https://bphc.hrsa.gov/programrequirements/scope.html
- BPHC will postpone all site visits planned through **July 31, 2020**.
- Will be adding codes related to COVID in UDS.
- 1,032 test centers responded to survey through April 17, down a little bit from previous week;
 1,900 sites have closed; 700 staff positive; 14 percent of staff not able to work; 53 percent virtual site visits

Of the \$100 million ... \$50 billion in general fund: initial \$30 billion based on Medicare fee for service reimbursements but remaining \$20 billion based on proportionate share of 2018 patient revenue, which should benefit CHCs more than the initial disbursement. Additional money for treatment of uninsured, sign up for this money begins April 27, submit claims on May 6, claims can go back to Feb. 4. \$10 billion for hospitals in high COVID-19 areas. \$10 billion for rural hospitals and rural health clinics. Could be additional money for special pops like nursing homes.

• In latest relief plan passed this week Another \$100 billion for healthcare. This includes \$25 billion for testing and \$75 million for healthcare providers. Testing includes \$600 million for health centers and FQHC lookalikes.
